## ***From the Pastor***

By the time you are reading this, school will be almost completely out for the year. The York Comprehensive High School faculty and the faculties of the other schools affected by the opening of the new High School will be busy with their packing and preparing for the moves made necessary by the opening of the new school. I was sharing with some folks my memories of the move to the then new Hickory Grove/Sharon Elementary in 1988. That move was simple compared to the moves going on in York School District One this year. Then it was two schools, one in Hickory Grove and one in Sharon, being closed and classes and services consolidated in the new school. This year's moves are more complicated. When the folks move out of the current YCHS building into the new one (and the same with the Technology Center), folks in the Junior High building will be moving into the old High; and there will be folks moving into the old Junior High. Harold C Johnson School will begin renovations. One move leads to another which leads to another.

I suspect that this is one of those truths that we can see taking place in life in any number of ways and places. As we prepare for Annual Conference our thoughts and prayers are with all of the congregations where the pastors are moving, and with all of the pastors who are moving to new congregations (even as we celebrate the fact that we will be together here at Trinity for another year at least). One move leads to another. One change leads to another. In the United Methodist Church we think of ourselves as being a "connectional Church." What happens in one congregation is felt in other congregations. We are tied together in a close connection.

Even more than this, though, the things that we do affect the folks around us. You saw it very clearly during our Senior Sunday service last week when one person's memories drew out memories from others, and one person's tears brought out tears from others (and from us seated in the congregation). When you or I make a promise and keep it, people see and notice. If I fail to do something that I have promised to do, then someone else has to do more work to make up for it (Last week I had promised Anna I'd bring home the flowers that we had placed in the Sanctuary. When I forgot, I ended calling Miss Alice and asking her to move them for me before Judy brought the flowers for the next week). What we do touches others.

We were blessed last Sunday to hear the seniors talk about how Trinity had touched them and their lives. We had some visitors from out of town who told me as they left, "This is a wonderful congregation. We can tell by the way your youth have grown and can share it." The folks who touched our youth continue to touch our young people, and our young people will go out and touch other lives—and your DNA will be in those changes as the work that has begun at Trinity continues to go on.

God bless each one. Thanks for all you do, and all of the ways you work together for the glory of God.
